Bodies, debris from missing AirAsia plane pulled from sea off Indonesia

Indonesian rescuers searching for an AirAsia plane carrying 162 people pulled bodies and wreckage from the sea off the coast of Borneo on Tuesday, prompting relatives of those on board watching TV footage to break down in tears.

Indonesia AirAsia's Flight QZ8501, an Airbus A320-200, lost contact with air traffic control early on Sunday during bad weather on a flight from the Indonesian city of

The navy initially said 40 bodies had been recovered, although other media later quoted the head of the search and rescue agency, Fransiskus Bambang Soelistyo, as saying only three bodies had been retrieved. The plane has yet to be found.

"My heart is filled with sadness for all the families involved in QZ8501," airline boss Tony Fernandes tweeted. "On behalf of AirAsia, my condolences to all. Words cannot express how sorry I am."



Pre-campaigns will start within 10 days

Facing the Federal Electoral Process currently operating, in less than 10 days the political pre-campaign period will begin, said Christian Flores Garza, vocal Training INE.

The official National

Electoral Institute (INE) said that this period will run until February 18 to make way for the registration of candidates, from 22 to 29 March.

The campaign period starts on April 5 and will run until June 4, three days before Election Day to be held on June 7.

After passing away in America, about 240 bodies of people from Durango (an average of 20 per month) were brought back to their families this year with the assistance of the Directorate of International Affairs and Care for Migrants of the State which supported these families with the paperwork

and, in some cases, with some financial resources.

María Elena Castaños, director of that institution, explained that sad moments like these destabilize the mourning families of Mexican citizens in every way, because in economic terms, for example, these situations require up to 20,000 pesos in expenses, which some families just cannot afford all of sudden.

"We provide some guidance (to the relatives of migrants) from the first call, or when family members look up for our help. The best option is to pay a visit to the Consulate where advices regarding this matters are provided. Then, after knowing the full situation and the possible expenses, the families can decide their best choice," commented the state official.

Jennifer Aniston considers that the greatest success about her career has been to be able "to make people laugh," said the actress in London while promoting her new film, "Horrible Bosses 2". "For me, as for many other actors, the most important thing is to make people laugh and forget about their problems... get a laugh is really rewarding. I believe that laughter is healing," said the actress.

Aniston, who jumped into fame after the massive success of the TV Show "Friends" was in London with her cast mates Jason Bateman, Charlie Day and Jason Sudeikis, to promote her new comedy, which is the sequel to 2011, "Horrible Bosses".



In the first film, the three great friends, tired of putting up with their bosses, decided to organize a plan to kill them without considering the consequences of such a radical decision.

In this second part, directed by Sean Anders, the three friends Nick (Bateman), Dale (Day) and Kurt

(Sudeikis), decide to build their own business and be their own bosses, but an investor, interpreted by Christoph Waltz, tricks and spoils their plans.
